Graduate Research Assistant (multiple positions)

This Graduate Assistant will help support the psychology department in its data collection and research activities, including data analysis, writing, and research.

Graduate Teaching Fellow (open to PsyD students only)

This position will assist a faculty member with a master's psychology course. Responsibilities include co-developing a syllabus for the course that is consistent with program expectations; provide partial instruction in the classroom, including lecture and supervision of activities and role-plays in class; evaluation of student performance on assignments and activities; and assistance in assigning final grades.

Graduate Teaching & Research Fellowship (multiple positions)

Teaching and Research Assistants will assist faculty in the Doctor of Psychology, Master of Science in Counseling Psychology, and Master of Arts in Psychology programs. Responsibilities include teaching, research activities, and administrative tasks. Specifically, students will assist with course preparation/maintenance; assist professors during class time; provide students with feedback outside class time; and conduct literature reviews.

Student Success Coach (multiple positions, open to PsyD and MSCP students only)

Success Coaches will interact with undergraduate students in one-on-one sessions and through co-facilitating a 1-credit student success course to make sure they have the resources they need to succeed at Chatham. Coaches troubleshoot issues that might prevent their successful transition to and ability to stay in college and develop ongoing relationships with the undergraduate students. They effect real change in their lives, as well as gain significant experience through training, observing, and working with students.

Teaching Assistant

Teaching Assistants will assist faculty in the Doctor of Psychology, Master of Science in Counseling Psychology, and Master of Arts in Psychology programs. Specific responsibilities include assisting with course preparation/maintenance, assisting professors during class time, and providing students with feedback outside class time.

Graduate Research Assistant – Pennsylvania Center for Women and Politics (PCWP)

This Graduate Assistant will help support the Pennsylvania Center for Women and Politics and will assist in data collection and analysis, writing, and research related to women in politics and public policy in Pennsylvania.
