Graduate Student Financial Assistance

GRADUATE ASSISTANTSHIP/FELLOWSHIP POSITIONS

A limited number of assistantships and fellowships are available to qualified, full-time graduate students, to work with a faculty or staff member on research or teaching based projects. Assistantships and fellowships provide students the ability to gain valuable hands-on experience, expanded learning opportunities, and professional growth possibilities.

- Positions are awarded in the form of remitted tuition, and can save a student 30% or more off the price of tuition (depending on the number of credits taken per term)
- Positions may be renewable for a second academic year, depending on the length of the program in which the student is enrolled and academic/job performance
- **Newly enrolled graduate students** beginning in the fall will be given preference in the award process
- Assistantships require between 10-15 hours per week of work during the academic year
- Students enrolled in the Integrated Degree Program (IDP)
 are not eligible to receive an assistantship or fellowship.

Students must first apply to their academic program of choice, and then may submit an assistantship award application. The priority assistantship application deadline for most programs is **February 1**, and students who apply for an assistantship on or before this date will receive first consideration for a position. Chatham will award positions on a rolling basis thereafter until all positions are filled.

- Promotions and Social Media Coordinator (Business & Entrepreneurship)
- Research Assistant (MA Teaching)
- Food Systems Policy Assistant (MA Food Studies)
- Teaching Assistant (MS Green Chemistry)
- Digital Video Specialist (MFA Film and Digital Technology)
- Research Assistant (MS Counseling Psychology)
- Aquaculture and Aquatic Ecology Assistant (Master of Sustainability)
- Fourth River Literary Journal Fellowship (MFA Creative Writing)

ON-CAMPUS EMPLOYMENT

A number of paid graduate student employment positions exist in various academic and administrative offices across campus, including Jennie King Mellon Library, the IT Help Desk, the Athletic and Fitness Center, and the Office of Student Affairs.

- Graduate students may work in an on-campus job up to 19 hours per week. The salary for graduate students is typically \$10 per hour.
- Student employees are paid by way of a physical check on a monthly basis or may sign up for direct deposit
- Open positions are posted on Chatham CareerLink Career Development's online database of employment opportunities – before the beginning of the academic year.
- Some examples of on-campus employment positions include:

- · Admissions ambassador
- Rock wall supervisor in the AFC
- · Desk attendant for the Office of Residence Life

TUITION REDUCTION GRANT PROGRAM*

Full-time employees of our corporate partner companies and organizations receive a special 20% tuition reduction (provided all eligibility requirements are met).

- Applicants who work for companies and organizations not found on our partner list should contact the Office of Admission to find out how they can be added.
- Students who take advantage of this grant program must produce proof of employment each term of enrollment before the 20% will be subtracted from the tuition bill.
- Students who receive this 20% tuition reduction are not eligible for any other reduced tuition rates offered by the University, including assistantships and fellowships.

ALUMNI DISCOUNT PROGRAM*

This discount applies to graduates of an undergraduate Chatham degree program pursuing a graduate degree at Chatham University. Students receive a 20% tuition reduction (provided all eligibility requirements are met).

*Students enrolled in the entry-level Occupational Therapy, Doctor of Physical Therapy, Master of Physician Assistant Studies, Doctor of Psychology in Counseling Psychology, Master of Science in Nursing, RN-to-BSN, RN-to-MSN, and all certificate programs are ineligible to participate in the Tuition Reduction Grant and Alumni Discount programs.

Yellow Ribbon Program

Chatham University is a proud participant in the Yellow Ribbon GI Education Enhancement Program. A provision of the Post-9/11 Veterans Educational Assistance Act of 2008, the program provides matching funds from the Department of Veterans Affairs as a supplement to the Post-9/11 GI Bill.
