**Addendum to Fully Online Undergraduate Degrees**

In accordance with the curricula approved by the faculty, students enrolling in fully online undergraduate degree programs in **Business or Psychology** will complete a 3 credit hour requirement in science.

**Clarifying Doctor of Psychology (PsyD) Course Requirements:**

*The minimum required credits for the PsyD program is 85. To clarify a miscommunication in the 15-16 Catalog, the following Field Experience courses are optional for the PsyD and are NOT required for graduation:*

**PSY851 - SUPERVISED FIELD EXPERIENCE (1 CREDIT)**

The course provides doctoral students the opportunity to obtain experience providing services in community settings. The course is reserved for those settings in which supervision is provided by professionals who are not licensed psychologists, but represent other professions (social work, psychiatry, counselors, etc.).

**PSY852 - SUPERVISED FIELD EXPERIENCE (2 CREDITS)**

The course provides doctoral students the opportunity to obtain experience providing services in community settings. The course is reserved for those settings in which supervision is provided by professionals who are not licensed psychologists, but represent other professions (social work, psychiatry, counselors, etc.).

**PSY853 - SUPERVISED FIELD EXPERIENCE (3 CREDITS)**

The course provides doctoral students the opportunity to obtain experience providing services in community settings. The course is reserved for those settings in which supervision is provided by professionals who are not licensed psychologists, but represent other professions (social work, psychiatry, counselors, etc.).

*The following Psychometrics course IS required for the PsyD:*

PSY716 - PSYCHOMETRICS (2 CREDITS)

The course offers theories and techniques related to the design, administration, and interpretation of quantitative tests measuring psychological variables such as intelligence, aptitude, and personality traits. It does not involve actual test design, administration and interpretation, but does explore theories and techniques related to these activities.

*PsyD students must complete 6 credits of Dissertation study from among the following courses:*

PSY862 - DISSERTATION I (3 CREDITS)

These courses are capstone scholarly projects that demonstrate an original contribution to the field of counseling psychology.

PSY862A - DISSERTATION I (1 CREDIT)

These courses are capstone scholarly projects that demonstrate an original contribution to the field of counseling psychology.

PSY862B - DISSERTATION I (2 CREDITS)

These courses are capstone scholarly projects that demonstrate an original contribution to the field of counseling psychology.

PSY862C - DISSERTATION I (3 CREDITS)

These courses are capstone scholarly projects that demonstrate an original contribution to the field of counseling psychology.

PSY863 - DISSERTATION II (3 CREDITS)

These courses are capstone scholarly projects that demonstrate an original contribution to the field of counseling psychology.

PSY863A - DISSERTATION II (1 CREDIT)

These courses are capstone scholarly projects that demonstrate an original contribution to the field of counseling psychology.

PSY863B - DISSERTATION II (2 CREDITS)

These courses are capstone scholarly projects that demonstrate an original contribution to the field of counseling psychology.
