Access to Free Academic & Research Resources

Continuing Medical Education Credits

Program faculty appreciate your time and effort associated with training our students and future colleagues. In acknowledgement of your time, Chatham offers continuing education opportunities to you. Physicians receive Category II CME Credits toward the AMA Physician's Recognition Award (PRA). Physician assistants receive Category I or II CME Credits.

Our program will provide you with your total precepting hours or AAPA Category 1 CME Certificate upon completion of the students' rotations. You are responsible for submitting your credit hour information to Chatham University PA program by May 31, the end of each rotational year.

Continuing Education Lectures and Credits

The College of Health Sciences hosts two to three presentations annually through our grants department. Topics generally include integrated health, integrated care, and team-based care, with an emphasis on underserved populations. Presentations take place in person, virtually, or hybrid in some cases. These presentations benefit students, educators, and practitioners across a variety of health science disciplines.



Chatham University PA Program is approved by the American Academy of Physician Assistants to award AAPA Category 1 CME credit to PA preceptors. This program was planned in accordance with AAPA's CME Standards. As of June 2022, preceptors may now earn an unlimited number of AAPA Category 1 CME for their precepting efforts from programs accredited by AAPA to provide these CME. Preceptorship CME is still earned at a rate of two AAPA Category 1 CME credits per PA student per 40-hour week.
