This timeline is designed to help you prepare for your start at Chatham this fall. Please carefully review this packet. Completing all necessary forms and familiarizing yourself with this information is a sure step toward your success at Chatham University.

Welcome to Chatham, and we look forward to seeing you in August!

WHEN ACCEPTED

- Pay your tuition deposit of \$150 at admission.chatham.edu/ apply/status
- Sign up to attend a New Student Registration Day at chatham.edu/undergrad-events. Earlier registration provides premium housing choices and best selection of courses! At a New Student Registration Day, you will receive your fall class schedule, receive your student ID, learn how to set up your Chatham e-mail, and meet members of the Chatham community.

PRO TIP: Pick up your Student ID card when you attend New Student Registration Day on campus. Submit information at least five days before the event at chatham.edu > Admission & Aid > New Student Registration Day > Get Your Student ID.

- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at studentaid.gov and list Chatham's school code: 003244. Reminder that a completed FAFSA is encouraged in order to maximize your financial aid package and to determine your eligibility for need-based aid, work study, and federal loans.
- Reserve your place in on-campus housing at my.chatham.edu
 My Tools > Student Housing. A \$150 housing reservation fee (paid at this same site) is required to reserve your place and fill out the housing application. Note: you must be a deposited student in order to complete the housing application.
- Application for Commuter Student Status: Chatham University has a two-year residency requirement that requires students to reside in on-campus housing their first two years at Chatham. Exceptions to this policy can be found at chatham.edu/student-experience > Housing & Dining > Undergraduate Housing. Students who wish to commute and not live-on campus must complete the Application for Commuter Student Status. Applications can be found at my.chatham.edu > Services & Departments > Residence Life. Once approved, commuter students are able to apply for a parking pass through my.chatham.edu.

 Ensure that your appointments are scheduled to meet with your physician to complete your medical forms via Med+Proctor.

Health/Immunization Record Information

You are required to submit health information and immunization record information by August 1, 2025, through a secure web-based software platform called Med+Proctor. A list of required and recommended vaccinations can be found at my.chatham.edu > Services & Departments > Student Health Services. We recommend starting this process as soon as possible.

Create your account at secure.medproctor.com by selecting New Users-Register and using your Chatham e-mail address. *If asked to pay for a Pro Account, select No Thank You.* Med+Proctor is a free service, and the Pro account is not needed at any point during this process.

Documentation MUST be uploaded to Med+Proctor; we cannot accept records via fax, mail, or e-mail. If you have technical issues, contact Med+Proctor directly at help@medproctor.com or by visiting support.medproctor.com.

APRIL

Official financial aid offers will be sent via Chatham's secure award system.

- Log into your financial award letter via your student portal at https://portal.chatham.edu. The Office of Financial Aid will receive notification regarding your acceptance and/or denial of the financial aid you were awarded.
- Students should complete federal loan documents, Promissory Note and Entrance Counseling at studentaid.gov by July 1.
- If you haven't already done so, sign up to attend a New Student Registration Day at chatham.edu/undergrad-events.

MAY

Housing Application & Reservation Fee Priority Consideration Deadline: Housing applications are accepted on a rolling basis, however housing is only guaranteed for students who deposit and apply by June 1.

Students applying between May 1-June 1 will be notified of their housing placement by mid-July. Students who apply for housing after June 1 will be placed on a space available basis.

- Meal Plans
 - All first-year residential students must purchase the Chatham 21 Plan. After the first year, residential students have the choice of meal plans, depending on whether they live on upper or lower campus.
 - Transfer students living on upper campus must purchase the Chatham 21, 14, or 10 Plan.
 - Transfer students living in Chatham-owned apartments must purchase one of the Chatham or Apartment plans.
 - **Commuter students** can sign up for a meal plan by clicking on the link within the commuter application.

MAY 1

- Deadline for PA residents to file the FAFSA at studentaid.gov in order to be eligible for PHEAA state grant.
- If you haven't already done so, sign up to attend a New Student Registration Day at chatham.edu/undergrad-events.

JUNE

- The Office of Admission needs to receive the following information to complete your file:
 - Final official transcripts from your high school and all colleges attended.
 - O Advanced Placement (AP) test scores, if applicable
 - Dual enrollment/Post-Secondary Education Option (PSEO) college transcripts, if applicable.
 - International Baccalaureate Diploma/Certificate, if applicable.
- Notify your admission counselor and the Office of Financial Aid of any additional outside scholarships you receive. You'll want to make sure that you have funds sent to the Office of Financial Aid to credit your account before tuition bills are sent out.

JUNE 1

- Guaranteed Housing Application Deadline: Students who apply after this date will be placed on a space available basis.
- O Housing & Dining Medical Accommodation Request

 Deadline: Students who would like to submit a medical
 accommodation request related to student housing or their meal
 plan are encouraged to do so by June 1. For instructions and
 application information, visit my.chatham.edu > Services &
 Departments > Medical Accommodations
- Living Learning Community (LLC) Application Deadline: If you are interested in being considered for one of our Living Learning Communities, complete the LLC section of your housing application by today. Learn more about LLCs at my.chatham.edu > MyTools > Student Housing.
- Roommate Request Deadline: If you would like to request a specific roommate, roommate requests are due today. Roommate request must be mutual, meaning a request must be sent by both students and accepted through the online housing application. Chatham attempts to honor all roommate requests, but they are not guaranteed and are dependent upon space availability. Visit my.chatham.edu > MyTools > Student Housing.

JULY

- Chatham offers 2, 3, 4, and 5-month payment plans during the fall and spring terms. Monthly installments are due on the 15th of each month. The final payment for fall plans is November 15, and the final payment for spring plans is April 15. Enrollment dates for the fall term are as follows:
 - 5-month plan: July 1-July 14
 - 4-month plan: July15-August 14
 - 3-month plan: August 15-14
 - 2-month plan: September 15-October 14
- Deposited students who are registered for fall classes can begin enrolling in Student Health Insurance coverage after July 1 on my.chatham.edu. Direct questions regarding Student Health Insurance to the Office of Student Accounts at studentaccounts@chatham.edu or 412-365-2718. All students are required to have insurance coverage.

- O If you did not already pick up your student ID card at a New Student Registration Day, submit information for your student ID card at orientation.chatham.edu. You will receive your ID when you come to campus for move-in or orientation. For more information, contact OSA@chatham.edu.
- Begin to research book purchasing options for fall classes. If you know your course schedule, you can find required textbooks at chatham.ecampus.com.

JULY 1

- Tuition statements mailed July 1 to all registered students
- Complete Master Promissory Notes and Entrance Counseling by today at studentaid.gov.
- Completed Verification process with Financial Aid is required by today and submit tax information if required.

JULY 15

5-month fall payment plan: First tuition payment is due today. Five monthly installments beginning on July 15 for the fall term and December 15 for the spring term.

AUGUST

- Register for New Student Orientation at chatham.edu/ orientation. Contact the Office of Student Affairs at osa@chatham.edu with questions.
- If you have not done so yet, complete your Laptop Choice Form at chatham.edu > Academics > Support & Services > Technology Resources
- Work on completing the AlcoholEdu and Sexual Assault Prevention modules. Instructions and module due dates were sent to your Chatham e-mail in late July.

AlcoholEdu and Sexual Assault Prevention AlcoholEdu and Sexual Assault Prevention are mandatory online programs.

AlcoholEdu, a nationally recognized program, is designed for all students—whether you are a frequent drinker or a non-drinker. This educational tool will help prepare you for college life and will provide the University with important data, which can help Chatham gain grants and offer better program opportunities for students.

The widespread impact of sexual violence presents an urgent and pressing challenge for our nation's campuses. **Sexual Assault Prevention** addresses the critical issues of sexual assault, relationship violence, and stalking, which impact countless college students across the country.

Start exploring campus employment opportunities on Handshake at chatham.joinhandshake.com/login. Use your Chatham username and password to set up your account, click on Jobs, and apply the On Campus filter. Students with a Federal Work Study (FWS) Award may begin applying for on-campus employment on August 1. Students not receiving work study may begin applying for on-campus employment on September 15.

AUGUST 1

- Health/immunization records due today via Med+Proctor. If you have not yet completed this requirement, you must do so before you arrive to campus later this month.
- 8-month payment plans: First tuition payment is due today. Four monthly installments beginning on August 15 for the fall term and December 15 for the spring term.
- Application for Commuter Status must be completed by today if you plan to commute to campus. Visit my.chatham.
 edu > Services & Departments > Residence Life

MOVE-IN

Specific information about exact move-in times will be provided by early July. New students will receive a specific move-in time slot via e-mail and be limited to two (2) guests to help them. Returning students will sign-up for a time slot and be limited to two (2) guests for assistance.

- New & Transfer Student Move-In
 Wednesday, August 20
 Incoming first-year and transfer students move into their
 residence hall or apartment and begin New and Transfer
 Student Orientation. A move-in time will be assigned to you
 prior to your arrival. Fall student athletes may move in prior
 to this date and will be notified accordingly.
- Returning Students
 Saturday, August 23
 Returning students move in.
